

The Right "Fit"

Before you start looking for a college, it helps to identify your preferences. Consider things like...

- Major or Academic interest
- School Type: two-year vs. four-year, public vs. private
- Location: Rural, Urban, Suburban
- Student Body: size, in-state vs. out-of-state
- Admission criteria (selectivity)
- Extra-curriculars activities: sports, clubs
- Costs: tuition vs. financial aid/scholarships
- Other: religious affiliation, special services



Top Factors in Admissions Decisions

- Grades in college prep courses
- Academic rigor
- Standardized test scores
- Essay or writing sample
- Demonstrated interest
- Letters of recommendation
- Extracurricular activities
- Leadership experience
- Interview (if available)



School Testing Policies


- Since the pandemic, many schools have chosen to remain
 Test Optional for the current senior class
 - Even though many schools are test optional, some programs may still require test scores to be submitted for certain programs
- What does this mean for current juniors?
 - Although many schools will remain Test Optional for the current junior class, it is important to stay up to date on testing policies for each individual school
- It still make sense to submit your test scores even if your schools are Test Optional

Extracurricular Activities

Quality Over Quantity

- Academic-oriented: Geared towards the field of study that you will pursue in college
- Leadership: Activity that helps show the admissions officers that you are hard-working, have people skills, and can be an innovator in your field
- Personality: Helps highlight the interesting and unique aspects of your personality and shows balance
- Community Service: Shows responsibility and empathy

Create A Resume

- A resume helps you to stand out from other applicants
- Naviance has a resume creator tool:
 - Log into <u>Naviance</u>
 - Click "About Me" in the top right corner
 - Using the drop down menu, select "My Stuff"
 - Click "Resume"
 - To add entries, click the plus button
- What to include in a HS Resume

Demonstrated Interest

A college/university is more likely to accept a student who demonstrates genuine interest:

- Communication
- Attend Open Houses and Campus Tours
- Meet with representatives at College Fairs and College Visits
- Interview (when available)
- Fill out questionnaires and comment cards

Letters of Recommendation

- 2 Academic Teacher Letters (Junior Year Teachers)
- 1 Counselor Letter
- Ask in person
- Fill out "Brag Sheets"
- Request through Naviance

Student Athletes

- By the end of junior year:
 - Register with the <u>NCAA Eligibility Center</u> and complete appropriate tasks
 - Reach out to coaches via email or online recruitment forms for the colleges you are interested in
- At the end of Junior year and beginning of Senior year:
 - Visit colleges and meet the prospective teams and coaches
- Senior year:
 - Complete all tasks required on your NCAA Eligibility
 Center account
 - Request transcripts to be sent by your school counselor
 - Follow up to make sure all documents are uploaded

Making Your College List

Reach

- Academically challenging: school whose admission criteria is above a student's profile
- Selective admissions
- Potentially high cost of attendance

Target

- Student is likely to be admitted because school's admission criteria is within a student's profile
- Student would be happy to attend that college
- Would not be financially overwhelming to attend

Safety

- Student is almost certain to be admitted because school's admission criteria is generally lower than a student's profile
- Student would be happy and get a good education there
- Affordable with reasonable effort

What Makes a College List Great?

- A final college list that includes 6-10 colleges
- Each college classified as Reach, Target, or Safety
- The bulk of the list is "target" schools
- Every college on the list is a school the student would be happy to attend



- Early Action
- Early Decision (binding)
- Rolling
- Regular Decision
- Open Admissions

Financial Aid

- What is Financial Aid?
 - All funds made available to students that do not come from their family
 - Scholarships, grants, loans, and work study funds
- Important Applications
 - Free Application for Federal Student Aid (<u>FAFSA</u>)
 Opens October 1st of your Senior Year all students (with parent) must complete to be considered
 - College Scholarship Search Profile (<u>CSS Profile</u>) only some schools require
 - Higher Education Student Assistance Authority (<u>HESAA</u>) - NJFAMS Account
- Scholarships: National, Local, & Private

Cost

- Make your list based on interest
 - Private colleges may be as affordable as public colleges
 - State colleges outside of NJ may be as affordable as NJ state colleges i.e. SUNY universities
- Use Net Calculators to refine your list
 - Collegeboard Net Price Calculator
- Leave your options open!

Junior Conferences

- Discuss individual college and career interests with student, parents (if available), and counselor
- Make preliminary plan
- Discuss resource materials and receive guidebook
- November January appointments
- Sign up for meeting through link emailed

To Do: By the End of Junior Year

- Attend your Junior Conference with school counselor
- Keep grades strong and stay engaged in extracurricular activities
- Develop a list of "Colleges I'm Thinking About" in Naviance
- Visit colleges utilize your breaks and your 3 excused absences
- Make a testing plan with a test timeline including dates and test preparation your first test should be taken by June and re-tests should be completed by the start of senior year
- Complete an activity resume
- Fill out brag sheets (counselor and teacher)
- Decide which teachers (typically two) that you would like to ask for a letter of recommendation and request in person by April/May of Junior year

To Do: This Summer

- Continue to VISIT schools!
- Write a first draft of your college essay
- Create a Common Application account (if applying through Common App) - opens August 1
- Finalize your college list in Naviance

Look Ahead to Senior Year

- Get started early!
- Attend Senior Night presentations
- Attend individual meeting with your school counselor
- Determine your deadlines
- Follow up with teachers writing your recommendations provide them deadlines and send Naviance request
- Meet with college representatives visiting HHHS
- Continue to visit colleges at open houses and campus tours
- Send official test scores from College Board or ACT
- Submit applications and fees
- Submit Transcript Request Form (the "golden ticket") to your counselor at least two weeks prior to college deadline
