# Middle School Goals: 2019-2020

#### Goal #1

Throughout the 2019-2020 SY, high-quality assessments will be used to evaluate student progress based on the curriculum/standards being taught in order to prepare students for high school. This will be measured by the collection of SGO's, marking period summative assessments, common assessments, *Link It* Benchmark assessments, and Quarterly assessments.

- 1) Marking period assessments with standards in all subject areas
- 2) Quarterlies with cover sheets that show correlation of standards covered and level of questions in major subjects
- 3) SGO's with standards and student grouping/results
- 4) Lesson plans weekly in Google folders
- 5) Google Sheets including *Go Math* Unit Assessments, Social Studies Writing, Science Writing, Language Arts Writing and Vocabulary

### Goal #2

By June 2020, 80% of students in grades 6-8 will demonstrate a minimum growth of 3 points on a standards-based computer assessment for Language Arts.

- 1) Develop a district assessment schedule for *LinkIt* administration (3 times);
- 2) Train teachers on *LinkIt* reports and standards-based data to drive instruction and remediate students;
- 3) Continue curriculum alignment for Language Arts;
- 4) Continue development of common assessments in Language Arts;
- 5) Continue common planning and grade level/department articulation (vertical and horizontal)

- 1) Develop a district assessment schedule for *LinkIt* administration (3 times)

- 3) Continue curriculum alignment for Mathematics
- 4) Continue development of common assessments for Mathematics
- 5) Continue common planning and grade level/department articulation (vertical and horizontal)
