Fentanyl - Carfentanil - Formaldehyde What are these substances? Are they mixed in with these drugs? You May Not Know Until it is Too Late!

Fentanyl - Fentanyl is an extremely potent synthetic opioid—50 times stronger than heroin.

Those who use heroin or prescription drugs laced with fentanyl are at much higher risk of overdose and death.



Formaldehyde - A colorless, flammable, strong-smelling gas. It can be found in building insulation, glues, paints, lacquers, fertilizers, pesticides, as

well as a preservative in funeral homes and medical labs.

Remember dissecting a frog?



Carfentanil - A fentanyl analog with a potency approximately 10,000 times that of morphine. It is used as a sedative for large animals, including elephants, but is not approved for use in humans. Side effects include itching, nausea, and potentially serious respiratory depression, which can be life-threatening.
