RESPECT - SHOWING OTHERS THEY ARE IMPORTANT BY WHAT YOU SAY AND DO.

DAY 1: Our Big Idea this month is respect: showing others they are important by what you say or do. The animal this month is the wolf and the color is yellow.

DAY 2: The wolf is highly respected in the animal kingdom because of his hunting skills. The alpha male of each pack earns respect from the others and they show it by following him.

DAY 3: Our Big Idea this month is respect: showing others they are important by what you say or do. Here's a rhyme to help you remember to be respectful: By the words you use and what you do, you show respect for others and you!

DAY 4: Yellow is a color that is often used to let us know to watch out. Stop lights and street lights use yellow to say "wait—look

at this." Yellow curbs say "don't park here" and yellow edges on steps can alert us to a dangerous step. Try to think of how many ways yellow is used in our world to remind us to respect a rule or law or to keep us safe.

DAY 5: Respecting yourself is very important. You can show respect for yourself by taking good care of your body. Getting enough rest is one way to be healthy and happy. Eating foods that are good for you gives you energy and helps you work and play hard. Exercising is another great way to show respect for your body.

DAY 6: This month our Big Idea is respect. Remember: by the words you use and what you do, you show respect for others and you!

DAY 7: Wolves are members of the dog family and can weigh as much as 175 pounds. They have been known to live up to 16 years in captivity, but the average lifespan in the wild is 6 to 8 years. Life in the wild can be hard, but the wolf is one of the most effective predators.

DAY 8: Respect is shown in many ways every day throughout our country. Standing for the pledge and the National Anthem are two ways we show respect for those who gave their lives for the freedoms we enjoy. Think of ways that we show respect in our school. Share one way we show respect in school with the person next to you.

DAY 9: A group of wolves is called a pack. There may be as few as 2 wolves in a pack, or as many as 30. Why do you think wolves

travel in packs? Think about what advantages there are to being in groups. What things are you able to accomplish more easily or better when you are with a group?

DAY 10: This month our Big Idea is respect. Remember: by the words you use and what you do, you show respect for others and you!

DAY 11: Showing respect for others can be done in many ways. In many cultures, younger people show older people respect by listening to their advice, giving them the place of honor at a gathering, or by asking their permission before they do something.

DAY 12: This month's Big Idea is respect. Today, say thank you to all the adults you see in school — your teacher, the custodians, every-

Attendance Regulation

“A pupil must be in attendance for 162 or more days in order to be considered to have successfully completed the instructional program requirements of the grade to which he/she is assigned.”

“Parents/guardians are responsible for notifying the school no later than 8:45 AM when a child is absent...”

“Any student’s absence requires a doctor’s note to be considered “excused”.”

“At no time will vacation days be considered “excused” for any reason.”

Should a child not be in school **for any reason** for 18 or more days
Retention is warranted.

- Vomiting
 - Symptom Free for 24 hrs
- Rashes
 - Dr's note
