Policy Updates – January 2025

Second Readings:

1. P 3125.2- Substitute Teachers

• As per NJDOE regulations all substitutes have 30 credits.

2. R 8462.1- Restraint and Seclusion

 Language revision – As per Administrative discretion, staff members will be trained in proper restraint techniques and protocols.

3. R 8462.1- Pupil Safety <u>AND</u> P 8601- Pupil Supervision

- Addresses late pick ups at the elementary schools. If a child must be brought to keys, parents will now be charged \$20.00 per hour, after two warnings.
- 4th or 5th graders must have a signed waiver, in order to be permitted to walk home from the after school Keys Program.

Policy Updates – January 2025

First Readings:

1. * P 5512 Harassment, Intimidation or Bullying

• HIB Investigations must pause when students are being criminally investigated; parental notification (in writing) is required to outline "pause."

2. * P & R 5533 Student Smoking

• School officials are to notify the Superintendent and the Police when there is reason to believe that an electronic device has been used on school property.

3. * P & R 7441 Electronic Surveillance in School Buildings and on School Grounds

• Requires a district to enter into an MOU with local PD to allow for viewing of video surveillance during an emergency event.

4. * P & R 9320 Cooperation with Law

• Designates specific individuals to be contacted by the PD with handle with care notifications.

*In alignment with the approved 2023 Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) and correlating Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

Policy Updates - January 2025

First Readings, Continued:

5. P & R 5111 Eligibility of Resident/Non-Resident Students

• Students of nonresident staff members of non certificated or certificated staff members are permitted to enroll their child(ren) within the district, with a set tuition rate, as per Executive County Superintendent Approval.

6. P 8500 Food Services

• Coincides with P 8505 and P 8561- Mandated Language changes pertaining to the SNAP program.

7. P 5460 High School Graduation

• Updates the requirement for all students to complete the financial aid application – starting with the class of 2025.

8. P 5701 Academic Integrity

• Replacing Plagiarism (5701) and updates discipline – to stay in line with codes of conduct at each level.

9. P and R 5516 Use of Electronic Communication Devices

• Updated policy changes and NEW Regulation to accompany the updates policy to outline expectations and discipline; no procedural changes to procedures with cell phones at any level; will continue to be in alignment with 5600.

10. P 5710 Student Grievances

Updating policy to include a process for student grievances.

Security Bid - Preliminary Planning

This security bid will address systems and platforms needed to ensure <u>student and staff</u> <u>safety</u>, including:

• A NEW Public Address (PA) System

- Up to date security announcements
- Separating announcements intended for Middle School or High School classrooms.

Completion of Surveillance Installation

• Hallways, stairwells and outdoor facilities will be complete, including Hitchcock and Depken Fields.

Installation of Telecommunication System

- Throughout the Middle/High School Facilities Classroom staff will be able to call the main office and into other classrooms.
- Classroom telephones will be enabled to call a lockdown from each room.

Security Bid-Timeline & Process

December 2024

- Board of Education approved the architecture firm to <u>provide a cost assessment</u> for bid proposal at the December BOE Meeting.
- Assessment provided at the end of the month.

January 2025

 Board of Education will <u>approve the architecture firm's</u> <u>cost assessment</u> and will begin the drafting of security bid proposal at the January BOE Meeting.

February 2025 - <u>ANTICIPATED</u>

- Board of Education intends to approve the architecture firm's <u>bid proposal at February BOE Meeting.</u>
- The district intends to engage in requisition for proposal (RFP) bidding process in March 2025
- Work to begin ASAP with completion intended for September 2025, prior to student arrival.
